

Fantastic Mr Fox - Chain of 20 Events

This whole story is a long-long chain of events. It means that one thing makes the next thing to happen. The first is the CAUSE, the next is the EFFECT.

There are two kinds of connectives (linking words) to link them together in a sentence:

You can link CAUSE and EFFECT with SO. (It means 'and because of that...')

For example: The foxes are hungry so they steal food.

You can link EFFECT and CAUSE with BECAUSE. (It answers the question: 'Why...?')

For example: The foxes steal food because they are hungry.

Attention! They are hungry BEFORE they steal, but you write it backwards!

1. It is hard to find food in the forest.
2. The foxes steal food from the farms.
3. The farmers hate the foxes.
4. The farmers want to kill the foxes.
5. The farmers shoot into the foxes' hole.
6. Mr Fox loses his tail.
7. The foxes are too afraid to come out.
8. The farmers want to dig the foxes out.
9. The foxes dig deeper than the farmers.
10. The farmers use diggers to dig deeper.
11. The foxes dig deeper than the diggers.
12. Many men wait around the foxes' hill.
13. The foxes cannot come out for many days.
14. The foxes run out of food.
15. The foxes dig long tunnels to the farms.
16. The foxes get a lot of food from the farms.
17. The foxes share their food with the animals.
18. The animals build a town underground.
19. The animals don't need to come out again.
20. The farmers just wait and wait.
