Fantastic Mr Fox - Chain of Events - Worksheet 2 (because)

This whole story is a long-long chain of events. It means that one thing makes the next thing to happen. The first is the CAUSE, the next is the EFFECT.

There are two kinds of <u>connectives</u> (linking words) to link them together in a sentence: In Worksheet 1, we have practised the first one: SO.
In Worksheet 2, we will practise the second one: BECAUSE.

You can link EFFECT and CAUSE with BECAUSE. (It answers the question: 'Why...?')

Question and answer: Why do the foxes steal food? Because they are hungry.

Together in the same sentence: The foxes steal food because they are hungry.

Attention! They are hungry BEFORE they steal, but you write it 'backwards'!

Continue the sentences with because and add the event before (the cause).

Use 'they' in the second half, where the two sentences start with the same nouns (subject). Use 'them' in the second half, where the two sentences end with the same nouns (object). Example: The foxes get a lot of food from the farms because they dig long tunnels to them.
