

Plan Your Journey Around the World

- Activity and Webquest -

Similarly to Jules Verne's famous book 'Around the world in 80 days', we are going to plan an actual journey around the world. For this webquest, you will look at countries on the world map and use your English to book tickets online (or check timetables and schedules).

Visit our EAL website >>> then go to **Around the world in 80 days** (below, among other stories)

- 1) check the map of Willy Fogg's 80-day long journey back in 1872
- 2) Go to Around the world TODAY webquest
- 3) check the maps and the plan of a 29-day journey that was actually possible in 2015.
- 4) click on the links in the last column of the plan and FILL IN THE BLANK BOXES in the chart called Plan Your Journey Around the World WEBQUEST
- 5) you can use an online currency converter to see all prices in the same currency (e.g. HUF)

NOW IT IS TIME PLAN YOUR OWN JOURNEY

- 5) get an Atlas from the Library or use a laptop to come up with a draft plan of a journey in 2018 that you would like to take.
- 6) write down the list of countries that you would travel through IN THE CHART
- 7) write down (possibly look up) the English word for each nationality in those countries, and the currency they use.
- 8) write down your idea of what means of transport you could use to get to the next country

Note: there is a Quizlet set on the website where you can check countries and nationalities:
VOCABULARY >>> NOUNS

RULES:

- a) NO FLIGHTS!!! the only flight allowed is for crossing the Pacific Ocean, because it is very hard to find a cruiser for that section.
- b) no rentals (cars, jets, helicopters, etc...)
- c) use means of transport that you can BOOK ONLINE (train, bus, ferry, cruiser, etc...)
- d) the journey must be shorter than 40,000 km, which is the length of Earth's Equator.

Special Awards for:

- the shortest journey (in km)
- the fastest journey
- the journey crossing the MOST countries
- the journey crossing the LEAST countries
- the cheapest journey
